THE GREAT CONTRAST:

CHAPTER 1, VSS. 1-9: WHAT GOD SEES

These are the positive things the Corinthian Church had; the spiritual blessings bestowed upon them by God's power and grace.

- 1. They are sanctified (vs. 2).
 - Sanctification of religion commands you to separate from the things of the world.
 "Stay away from..." "Thou shalt not..." etc.
 - ⇒ Does not remove the desire and temptation to do those things.
 - ⇒ Still in bondage to the vices that hold vou.
 - ⇒ You are religious, not fulfilled.
 - Biblical sanctification is separation FROM SIN, but "IN CHRIST JESUS."
 - ⇒ You are free from your old life and given a new life in Christ.
 - \Rightarrow Free from sin UNTO righteousness.
 - ⇒ Free from darkness INTO light.
 - ⇒ Free from the Devil TO Jesus Christ.
- 2. They are recipients of God's grace (Vss. 3-4).
 - ⇒ Saved by grace (past tense)
 - ⇒ Still receiving God's grace daily.
- 3. Rich in all utterance and all knowledge (vs. 5).
 - \Rightarrow Able to speak as God's representative.
 - ⇒ Having knowledge of things that most men don't know (origin of man, future of man, Character of God, etc.).
- 4. They are gifted by God (vs. 7).
 - ⇒ Supernaturally enabled to serve God.
- 5. Confirmed blameless unto the end (vs. 8).
 - ⇒ This is God's work, not man's.
 - ⇒ No flesh will glory in the Lord's presence (vss. 29-30).

VSS. 10-31: WHAT THE WORLD SEES

These are the things they lacked, which caused strife, division, contention, envy, competition, and disagreements.

- 1. They lacked unity of speech (vs. 10).
 - ⇒ Their speech focused on their individual differences and preferences.
 - ⇒ They should have talked about the things they had in common (see column to the left).
- 2. They lacked unity of purpose (vs. 10).
 - ⇒ They were divided according to their own preferences as to how to serve God.
 - ⇒ We may serve God in different ways, but for the same purpose.
- 3. They lacked unity of mind (vs. 10).
 - ⇒ This doesn't mean you must look at things the same way.
 - ⇒ It doesn't mean you have the same knowledge. Knowledge increases.
 - ⇒ (Philippians 2:1-4) It means you're willing to take the lowest place and exercise grace toward the brethren who are still learning and who don't do everything like you.
- 4. They lacked unity of judgment (vs. 10).
 - ⇒ Their standard of right and wrong was not united because they wouldn't agree to stand on what the Bible said.
 - ⇒ If the Bible is your standard, the least person in the church can come to the right decision.
- 5. CONCLUSION: they lacked a heart application of what God had given them.
 - ⇒ If your heart is not yielded to God's control, the church will be in a mess!

We MUST be in right fellowship with Jesus Christ in order to be what God wants us to be (vs. 9). If you and I are BOTH in right fellowship with the Lord, we will be united in all that we do. Don't lose sight of Jesus Christ!
