THE WAY OF HAPPINESS

Psalm 1

In Psalm 1, we are introduced to two very different ways of life: the way of the godly, and the way of the ungodly. Only one of those ways leads to blessedness. The other leads to certain destruction.

Similar Comparisons:

- The narrow way that leads to life and the broad way that leads to destruction (Mt 7:13).
- The good tree that bears good fruit and the corrupt tree that bears evil fruit (Mt 7:17).
- The house built on the rock and the house built on the sand (Mt 7:24-27).

Blessed: Supremely happy or fulfilled. Plural form here (Heb) denotes a large number of blessings, or blessings many times over.

I. THE PROMISE OF HAPPINESS.

This Psalm reveals God's desire that we be happy.

- Many unbelievers reject Christ because they have a wrong view of God. They think God wants to burden them down and take away the things that make them happy.
- God has given us His word that we might delight in it and satisfy our soul (vs 2).

II. THE MEANS OF HAPPINESS.

The psalmist begins with a negative to help us understand that there are things we must **stay away from** if we are ever to know true happiness (vs 1).

- There are some voices you will have to ignore in this world.
- There are some places you will have to avoid.
- There are some people you will have to disassociate (separate) from.

A. AVOID THE COUNSEL OF THE UNGODLY.

- People who hate God are not going to provide you with the right answers to your questions.
 - Their counsel will be ungodly.
 - o Their message is contrary to God's truth; advising you to pursue happiness.
 - Happiness is a byproduct of something else. God provides the *path* that *results* in happiness.
 - Riches and gifts and nice things that you purchase to try and make yourself happy will only last momentarily. After that you will look for the next thing—and the next.
- Jesus taught that those who seek righteousness (not happiness) shall be filled (Mt 5:6).
 - Our happiness depends on our relationship with God and His righteousness.
 - Our happiness depends upon what we are, not what is happening to us.
- Notice the deviation away from the godly way:
 - Walking in the counsel of the ungodly.
 - Standing in the way of sinners.
 - Sitting in the seat of the scornful.
 - Bible Examples of straying from God's Way:
 - **Samson** (Judges 14-16)
 - **Lot** (Gen 19:1)
 - Positive Example of standing with God: Joseph (Gen 39:9).

B. DELIGHT IN THE LAW OF THE LORD.

- The godly man's godly associations are not what makes him happy. He is happy because he delights and meditates on God's word day and night.
 - Delighting: if you only open the bible when you attend a bible study or a preaching service, you are not delighting in the word of God. You're missing out on the happiness that God wants you to know.
 - o **Meditating**: patiently and thoroughly reflecting on the scriptures for several days after you have read them, studied them, or heard them preached.
- Why would we not delight in God's word and meditate upon it?
 - We are spiritually sick (with sin).
 - We are spiritually dead (not saved).

III. THE DESCRIPTION OF THE HAPPY MAN (verse 3)

• "He shall be..." God is interested in what we are becoming. When we become what God would have us to be, then we will do what is right (James 1:22).

A. FOUR TREE-LIKE CHARACTERISTICS OF A GODLY LIFE.

- **1. PLANTED**. "And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water." That is because God has planted you. He is taking action in your life. We are stable and strong because we are rooted in Christ (Col. 2:7).
- **2. FRUITFULNESS**. "—that bringeth forth his fruit in his season." A living tree will bear fruit. The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, patience… (Gal. 5:22). These are characteristics of a godly life.
- **3. STABILITY.** "—his leaf also shall not wither." Adversity in your life will not cause you to dry up on God and quit.
- **4. PROSPERITY.** "—and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." You will be actively and successfully doing what God called you to do (2 Cor 9:11).

IV. THE DESCRIPTION OF THE UNGODLY MAN.

- "The ungodly are not so—" (vs 4) He is not delighting and meditating on the word of God. He is not planted like a tree. He is not fruitful. He is not prosperous.
- "but are like the chaff—" this is in contrast to a tree.
 - A. CHAFF. A PICTURE OF WASTE. Chaff is worthless, blown away with the wind.
 - A life apart from Jesus Christ is empty, like the husk of chaff.

B. THE UNGODLY WILL NOT STAND IN THE JUDGMENT (vs 5).

- No one can withstand the judgment of God without the righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- "Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous." Today sinners go to church, but in the day of Judgment, the goats will be removed from the sheep, the tares from the wheat.
- "The Lord knoweth the way of the righteous." The Lord knows who His are (Jn 10:14).
- "but the way of the ungodly shall perish."
