1. Errors (Lev. 4:1-17).
a. These are sins committed through ignorance.
b. They require a blood atonement (like any sin does) to cleanse your guilt.
c. Illustrated by Saul of Tarsus. He ignorantly persecuted Christians.
2. Secret Faults. (James 5:16).
a. These are defects, not sins (temper, depression, laziness, impulsiveness, moral weakness, lust, hypersensitivity, etc).
b. Faults have the potential to do great damage.
c. You must deal with your faults before God.
d. We are commanded to confess our faults to one another so we can pray for each other to get victory over that fault.
e. Illustrated by Peter. His impulsive nature was a fault that led him to deny the Lord Jesus.

## 3. Presumptuous sins.

a. These are willful, premeditated sins against God. (i.e. Genesis 37:12-36).
b. Committed when a person presumes that they can sin and God won't care or will simply forgive them.
c. Illustrated by David. His lust for Bathsheba wasn't presumptuous, but his plan to murder her husband was.
