## I. BY ONE MAN (v.15)

- A. One Man Brought Sin Adam (v.12) "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world."
  - The world was made by God (Psa. 104:31, 104:24) and was "very good," according to God (Gen. 1:31). It was untouched by sin when God made it.
    - o No danger, no worries, no knowledge of good and evil.
  - God gave man a free will. Man could choose to love and obey God, or to disobey and show a lack of love and trust in God.
    - When presented with one opportunity to do wrong, man failed, bringing sin and death into the world.
- B. One Man Brought Grace Jesus (1Corinthians 15:45-49)
  - "The last Adam (Jesus Christ) was made a quickening spirit." (One that gives life).
  - Our heavenly Lord made it possible for us to "bear the image of the heavenly" one day.
- II. <u>UNTO MANY (v.15)</u> "the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many."
  - A. <u>Multitudes have Believed</u> (Acts 5:14; 14:1) "...multitudes both of men and women." "A great multitude both of the Jews and also of the Greeks believed."
  - B. Multitudes will be in Heaven (Revelation 7:9-10) "which no man could number"
    - Oftentimes it seems to us that nobody is getting saved (1 Ki. 19:10, 14). We can't see everything that God is doing (1 Ki. 19:18).
    - God is not finished yet. He will continue to reap His harvest until Jesus returns.
      - Don't let the Devil talk you into quitting when you don't see big results in witnessing.
- III. <u>BY GRACE (v.15)</u> "much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ."
  - A. The Grace of God
    - 1. The gospel of the grace of God (Acts 20:24)
    - 2. The bestowing of the grace of God (1Corinthians 15:10)
    - 3. The offer of the grace of God (Titus 2:11)
  - B. The Gift by Grace (Ephesians 2:8-9) "For by grace are ye saved through faith"
    - Salvation cannot be worked for and thereby earned. "It is the gift of God: not of works..."

## IV. UNTO JUSTIFICATION (v.16) "but the free gift is of many offences unto justification."

- Only one offense brought condemnation.
- Jesus Christ took upon Him MANY offenses—unto justification.
  - His gift makes it possible for us to be declared just and righteous before God.
  - If you choose to stand before God on your own record of righteousness, you will remain condemned.
- A. Justified by His Grace (Romans 3:24)
- **B.** Justified by His Blood (Romans 5:9)
- **C.** Justified from Condemnation (Romans 8:33-34)
- **D**. Justified by the Faith of Jesus Christ (Galatians 2:16)
- V. <u>UNTO LIFE (v.17, 18)</u> "they which receive abundance of grace...shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ." "by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life."
  - A. Passed from Death unto Life (John 5:24)
  - **B**. Given Eternal Life (Romans 5:21; 6:23)
  - **C.** Promised a Resurrection Life (1Corinthians 15:21-22)
  - **D**. Enriched with Abundant Life (John 10:10)
- VI. BY HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS (v.18) "by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all"
  - A. The Sinless Righteousness of Christ (2Corinthians 5:21)
  - **B**. The Imputed Righteousness of Christ (Romans 3:9)
  - **C**. The Righteousness which is of God by faith (Philippians 3:9).
- VII. BY HIS OBEDIENCE (v.19) "by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous."
  - "I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me." (John 5:30)
  - **A**. In Life (John 6:38; 15:10)
  - **B**. In Death (Hebrews 5:8; Philippians 2:5-8)
    - Jesus was equal with God, but took the form of a servant, becoming obedient unto death of the cross.
