John 3:16

For God <u>so loved</u> the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

I. His Love Is Unsearchable (Ephesians 3:18-19)

- A. Christ's love covers every dimension (physical and spiritual) all the way to heaven (v.18).
- **B.** The Love of Christ is more than mankind can know (v.19). It goes beyond what we can understand until we become a child of God through faith in Jesus Christ (Col 1:10, 2 Pet 3:18).
 - **1.** Even then, we can learn more about His love every day as we keep searching the scriptures.

II. His Love Is Great (Ephesians 2:4; John 15:13; Romans 5:6-10)

- **A.** "Great" is a measurement of intensity, of quantity, and of how much.
 - 1. Ephesians 2:4 states that God's love is "great."
 - **2.** Jesus said in John 15:13 that laying down your life for a friend is the greatest love a man can produce.

B. Men have different measurements of love.

- 1. "I love everybody." This is a very low level of love. It is impractical and unlikely.
 - a. Who is the unlovable person that God has placed in your path?
- **2.** Love for somebody you respect.
- **3.** Love for your spouse.
- 4. Love for your children.
- **5.** Love for military comrades (a type of brotherhood).
- **C. Romans 5:6-10**. Jesus went beyond laying down His life for a friend. He died for all the ungodly sinners who hate Him. He died for His enemies.
 - **1.** God's love is so great that He sent His own Son to die for His enemies.

III. His Love Is Manifest to Us (Titus 3:4, John 1:10-12, 2 Corinthians 8:9)

- A. The kindness and love of God APPEARED to men (Titus 3:4).
- **B.** John 1:10-12. We can see God's love in His way of salvation.
- **C.** We see God's love through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ (2 Cor 8:9).

IV. <u>His Love Is Sacrificial (Ephesians 5:2; 1 John 3:16; 4:10)</u>

- A. We are exhorted to love one another sacrificially, as Christ also hath loved us (Eph 5:2)
- **B.** We perceive the love of God by His sacrifice. He laid down His life for us (1 Jn 3:16).
- **C.** Love results in giving (Jn 3:16). If you don't give, you don't love.
 - 1. Parents make sacrifices because they love their children.
 - a. If parents don't love their children, still, the Lord loves them (Psa 27:10).
 - **2.** Adult children make sacrifices if they love their elderly parents.

- **D.** (1 John 4:10) The Lord Jesus Christ's sacrifice at Calvary is the greatest example of love that there is.
 - **1.** By His sacrifice, He made it possible to fellowship with God. This was never possible before (**Isa 59:2**). Jesus Christ took care of the sin that separated us.
 - a. **Good works** could not satisfy God. Everybody is a sinner (**Ecclesiastes 7:20**), therefore our righteous deeds are as filthy rags before a holy God (**Isa 64:6**).
 - I. God gave Israel His **Law**, but nobody could keep it.
 - II. God gave Israel **sacrifices** as a way to make things right with Him, but they were very limited (Hebrews 10:11). Israel didn't have a right heart when they brought God's sacrifices (**Isaiah 1:11,** 19). (Micah 6:6-8).
 - III. God gave **His Son**, Jesus Christ to suffer for us, be rejected by men, and to bear our sins in His body on the tree (**1 Peter 2:21-24**).
 - I. God provided Himself for us (Genesis 22:8) in a miraculous way (Gen 3:15).

V. <u>His Love Is Eternal (Romans 8:35-39)</u>

A. Nothing can ever separate us from God's wonderful love. (Luke 10:42, John 16:22, Deuteronomy 33:2-3).

Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life.
