# REVELATION: Lesson 100 Chapter 9:13-21, Supernatural Horses / The Importance of Repentance

- They come out of the pit (vs 3)
- Power like scorpions (vs 3)
- They do not kill (vs 5)
- Crowns (vs 7)
- These are like horses (vs 7)
- Have faces like men, hair like women (vs 7)
- Breastplates like iron
- Tails like scorpions (vs 10)
- Torment men for 5 months (vs 5, 10)
- Led by the angel of the bottomless pit (vs 11)
- John is not told how many locusts come out



- They come out of the river Euphrates (vs 14)
- Power in their mouth (vs 14)
- They do kill (vs 18)
- No crowns
- These are called horses (vs 16)
- Have faces like lions (vs 17)
- Breastplates of fire, jacinth, brimstone (vs17)
- Tails like serpents with heads (vs 19)
- Kill men for 391 days (vs 15)
- Led by the four loosed angels (vs 15)
- John hears there are 200 million horsemen

#### Supernatural Horses

2 Kings 2:11-12	Elijah was taken up to Heaven in a chariot of fire drawn by horses of fire.
2 Kings 6:17	Elisha's servant's eyes were opened to see God's army of horses and chariots of fire. This reveals the importance of walking by faith (2 Cor 5:7). There is more going on around us than our eyes can see. God's army protects us every day.
Revelation 19:11	Jesus returns to the Earth riding a white horse. There are horses in Heaven.
Revelation 19:14	An army of saints follow Jesus on white horses from Heaven.
Revelation 9:16	Just as Heaven has horses, Hell also has its horses.

#### **Revelation Chapter 9**

- Vs 13 The golden altar is "before God." Notice in Revelation 8:3 the altar is "before the throne." God is on His throne.
- Vs 15 This verse gives the length of this judgment. 30-days a month X 12 +31 = 391 days of killing.Men get killed by fire and brimstone and then wake up in the fire and brimstone of Hell with no end to their torment.

## God Judged Mankind in the Past, He'll Judge Mankind in the Future

- 1. In Noah's day, God sent a universal flood destroying all but 8 people (Gen 6-9).
- 2. In Lot's day, God rained down fire from heaven to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah (Gen 19:24).
- 3. In Pharaoh's day, God sent down 10 plagues upon the Egyptians (Exodus 7-12).
- 4. The Canaanites were punished repeatedly for their wickedness (Num 21:3, Deut 20:17-18, Jos 3:10)
- 5. Ahab and Jezebel's government brought the judgment of 3 years of drought (1 Kings 17:1, 18:1).
- 6. Nebuchadnezzar's kingdom was destroyed in one night (Jer 51:8).
- 7. The world today is exhibiting all of the wicked traits of these nations of the past (Eccl 1:9, 3:15). Today, sin is accepted, practiced, and glorified. Why should we not expect God's judgment?

### God's Judgment does not Result in Repentance (Rev 9:20, Rom 2:4)

- Mankind today has many advantages that earlier generations didn't have.
  - A Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ
  - o A complete Bible
  - o Gospel witnesses, street preachers
  - Christian TV, radio, and bookstores
  - o Established local churches
  - o Gospel tracts
  - Missionary programs
- With all these ways of getting God's truth to every person on earth, very few heed the gospel, repent, and turn to the Lord for salvation.
  - This rejection will bring God's judgment. There is no excuse today.
- God sends warning after warning to try and get people to look to Him for the solutions.
  - Hurricanes, floods, droughts, tornados, late freezes to destroy crops, pandemics and diseases (cancer, AIDS, swine flu, mad cow, Covid-19, etc.).
- People experience all kinds of dangers, setbacks, family situations, and difficult times.
  - Why do they refuse to look to God?
  - Why do they turn to drugs, alcohol, psychiatrists, and sinners for help?
- **Exodus 9:34-35**, Pharaoh hardened his heart after God sent plagues upon Egypt. He didn't repent.
  - He called on God when things were bad (Exod 10:16), but as soon as the urgency was gone, he didn't need God anymore. He didn't repent when God gave him space to repent.
  - $\circ$  People go to church when they need help. They disappear when they get what they want.
  - God's judgment may cause fear and terror in its early stages (Rev 6:16), but if you <u>delay</u> to repent and fail to take the necessary action to correct your situation and mend your relationship with God, you will begin to harden your heart against Him.
    - The longer you wait, the harder your heart will become.
    - Eventually you will grow bitter against God until you hate Him.
    - This is what will happen to those who survive God's judgement in the Tribulation time (Rev 9:20).
  - The Bible encourages early submission to God (Eccl 12:1, 2 Cor 6:2, Psa 34:11). The longer you wait, the harder your heart will become until you decide never to get right with God.
