REVELATION: Lesson 120

Chapter 13:1-4, The Antichrist: The Counterfeit Christ; Who is Like Him? / Making a God out of a Man

Rev 13:1 "The sand of the sea." This term occurs 18 times in the Old Testament and 4 times in the New Testament. In every case except Job 6:3 this refers to a vast multitude of people. The Beast is going to rise up out of the sea (of mankind), chosen by the people, and exalted by them.

Seven heads, ten horns, ten crowns: the dragon (Satan) has the real power (Rev 12:3), but it is presently concealed. When it is time to display his power, he will do it through the Beast (Antichrist).

Notice the **counterfeit** operation here: God's power was displayed through Jesus Christ, the man. Similarly, Satan's power will be displayed through a man (Antichrist).

Rev 13:2 "The beast...was like unto a leopard." A leopard has spots. Satan's man is spotted with sin. Jesus Christ is "the lamb without blemish and without spot" (1 Peter 1:18-19).

The power of the beast:

Leopard: in Jeremiah 5:6, the leopard is able to tear people to pieces. He is large, fierce, and swift to spring upon his prey (Dan 7:6, Hos 13:7, Hab 1:8).

Bear: the picture is that of a she-bear robbed of her whelps (2 Sam 17:8, Prov 17:12, Hos 13:8). Satan (mama bear) will be furious when he sees the church (whelps, cubs) taken off the Earth.

Lion: the mouth of a lion represents power and eagerness to destroy (Psa 17:12, Hos 5:14, 1 Pet 5:8).

- Rev 13:3 The Beast will be wounded "as it were" unto death. The word "as" indicates that he will not actually die; his wounds will be healed. People will be told that he resurrected from the dead, but Satan has never had the power to raise the dead or create life.
 - God is the one who makes alive (Deut 32:39) and quickeneth all things (1 Tim 6:13).
 - Jesus Christ is the **resurrection** and the **life** (John 11:25), He is the way the truth and the **life** (John 14:6).
 - Satan had the power of **death** (Heb 2:14). He doesn't have the power to give life.
- **Rev 13:4** "Who is like unto the beast?" Satan finally gets the worship he has always desired. He's not interested in being a world leader; he wants to be God. This is a religious endeavor.
 - More indications of a counterfeit operation.
 - Satan mimics the unseen God. No man hath seen God at any time (Jn 1:18, 5:37).
 - The Beast mirrors Jesus Christ. He that hath seen me hath seen the Father (Jn 14:9). Jesus is the express image of God (Heb 1:3), He is God manifest in the flesh (1 Tim 3:16). Similarly, the beast is the embodiment of Satan.
 - As the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and testifies of the Son (Jn 15:26), the false prophet is a counterfeit. He comes from Satan and testifies of the Beast.

WHY WILL MAN MAKE A GOD (IDOL) OF ANOTHER MAN?

- 1. Because they can see a man. It requires no faith (Heb 11:1, 6). They will religiously follow a man who possesses above average qualities.
- Man must consider things from an infinite point of view. God put the world in their heart (Eccl 3:11). God has given all men an understanding of His eternal nature. Creation reveals an eternal God (Rom 1:20). Man strives to be "as gods" (Gen 3:5), therefore he'll idolize a man who claims to be like the Most High (Isa 14:14), showing himself that he is God (2 Thess 2:4).
 - a. Young people idolize rebels (rock/rap stars, sports figures, effeminate men, macho women) because in their heart, that is what they desire to be. They admire the rebel's stand against authority.
 - b. The Antichrist will be the greatest rebel ever seen. People will flock after this man who is rich, powerful, successful, open-minded, without conscience, and unrestrained by a Holy God (Dan 11:36).
- 3. It gratifies and satisfies man's pride. Men imagine that they ARE the person whom they idolize. They dress and behave like their idol. A rebellious heart is at the root of it. If it resists righteous, holy authority, it appeals to the rebel heart.
- 4. **Their conscience is seared** as they observe the rebel remaining unpunished by the true God. It makes them bolder in their own defiance against God. *"My friends did it and nothing happened to them."* They knew God, but their foolish heart was darkened (**Romans 1:18-23**).
- 5. It sets them free to practice all human lusts. If we are all gods, everything we do will be alright with "god." You would never condemn any kind of sin or else you'd be condemning the "god" who is sinning.
 - a. It leads to idolatry. Idolatry leads to every kind of sin imaginable (Rom 1:24-32).
 - b. Immorality is joined to religion (Exod 32, the golden calf). It is religion without God.

WHO ARE YOU TRYING TO BE LIKE?

Psalm 115:1-8You will be like your god. If your god is a sinful man, you will be just like him. You will
be just like the one you exalt.

Romans 8:29If you are saved, the Holy Spirit is working to make you more and more like the Lord
Jesus Christ every day.

The exaltation of man above God is the spirit of Antichrist.
