Chapter 21:12-27 —Some Final Details About the Great City, New Jerusalem

The New Jerusalem differs and surpasses the Millennial Jerusalem in various ways.

The Gates to the City (vs 12)

Twelve gates stationed by twelve angels.

Names of the **twelve tribes** of Israel written on the gates.

• Israel's history (Law, prophets, covenants, fathers, etc.) can bring a person to the gates of the city but cannot get a person into the city.

The Inner Foundations of the City (vs 14)

The foundations contain the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

- It takes the New Testament **gospel** teaching of the **apostles** to get a person into New Jerusalem.
 - The Old Testament Law convinces a man of sin and reveals our inability to do right and our need of a Savior (Rom 7:7-12).
 - It brings us face to face with the fact that we cannot get in that city without Jesus.
 - Until the Law convinces you that you're guilty before God, you won't seek a Savior.
 - o Twelve gates reveal that there are **many approaches** to the throne of Jesus Christ.
 - No one can enter the city, but by Jesus Christ (only one gospel), but there are many ways that people **hear the gospel** and learn about the Lord and Savior.
 - Charismatic movement and other liberal denominations
 - Southern Baptist Convention and other worldly organizations
 - House visitation, walk an aisle in a church, hear street preaching, etc.

Perfection in This City

The number 12 is mentioned seven times (vs 12, 14, 21), representing the perfect government.

- Twelve apostles are the foundation of the Church.
- The wall with 12 gates shows a connection between what is inside the city (the Lamb and the Church) and what is outside the city (the earthly Jerusalem governing the world).
 - The earthly Jerusalem has connection with the earthly nations. The Church does not.
 - Today we should not get caught up in worldly affairs, trying to change the world.
 - The Church today needs to keep her eyes on heavenly things.
- Ephesians 2:20-22 The Church is built on the foundation of the apostles AND prophets.
 - o The apostles preached what the prophets wrote.

The Measurement of the City (Rev 21:15-16)

The city measured twelve thousand furlongs (1500 miles, 2400 km) and is a perfect cube as high as it is wide and deep.

• The Holy of Holies in the Temple was a perfect cube of 20 cubits and typified the New Jerusalem (1 Kings 6:20).

- Some teach that New Jerusalem is the shape of a pyramid.
 - This shape is not found in the Holy Bible.
 - The pyramid is a shape used in paganism.
 - o It is more likely that the city is a cube like the Holy of Holies.
- New Jerusalem is large enough to fit all of mankind from Adam to the year 2000 A.D.

The Wall of the City (Rev 21:17) The wall of the city measures 144 cubits

- A cubit (Latin *cubitus* = elbow) is the length from a man's (often a king) elbow to the tip of his middle finger (18-21 inches). That would make the wall approximately 216 feet.
- A wall 216 feet high in a city that is 1500 miles high (7 million feet), would not be called "Great and high" (vs 12).
 - o The measurement is not said to refer to the height.
 - The 144 cubits more likely refers to the width of the wall. (See Jeremiah 51:58 and Ezekiel 41:9 for biblical examples).
- The cubit used in the measurement of the wall is not the usual (18-22 inch) cubit. "The angel" is used as the standard of measurement here.
 - In the millennial temple, the temple was measured using a cubit and an hand breadth (Ezek 40:5, 43:13).
 - The wall of the city is likely bigger than 216 feet since the cubit used is that of "the angel."

The Measurement is that of "The Angel" (Vs 17)

The wording of this verse is significant. It reveals that the Lord Himself was the standard of measurement.

Where else is "hand breadth" used for a unit of measurement?

- **Exodus 37:12** The table of shewbread (border). Because only God can bring you into a place of communion with Him.
- **2 Chron 4:5** The molten sea. God is the only One who can make you clean enough to stand before Him.
- **Psalm 39:5** The length of your life is compared to an hand breadth. God gave you life and He is the only One who makes it possible to live a righteous life.

The Nations of Them Which are Saved (vs 24)

Men think the way to heaven is by uniting all of mankind (tower of babel).

- Today we see men working to erase all differences in people (race, sex, culture, nationality, etc.).
 - o Outside the body of Christ, the Lord never authorized such actions.
 - Even in eternity, there are still independent, separate, sovereign nations (twelve of them).
 God has a policy of segregation when it comes to the earthly nations.
- Psalm 72:8-17 All nations shall fall down before Him...and serve Him. Men shall be blessed in Him.
- Amos 9:11-12 A day is coming when all the heathen (non-Jew) will be called by God's name.
- **Micah 4:11-12** God will gather the nations as the sheaves to into the floor.
- **Isaiah 60:19-21** This is a great cross-reference for Revelation 21:23.
